To deliver consistent and effective learning experiences, a school needs a clear vision implemented by dedicated staff and supported by the School community.

TIGS Prep

Our preparatory program uses the Early Years Learning
Framework to create an environment that is carefully structured
to equip our youngest learners with the social, emotional and
foundational skills that will enable them to succeed in their Junior
School years. TIGS Prep students make a seamless transition
into Kindergarten, ready to start their academic journey.

Junior School

Students in our Junior School are equipped to become lifelong learners, empowered to think deeply and critically about the world and their place in it. The Junior School delivers highly personalised learning in Mathematics and Literacy through differentiated class groupings. Through transdisciplinary learning, students become skilled in research and reflection, growing in self-confidence which allows them to enter Senior School as self-directed learners.

Senior School

To prepare students for the ever-changing world, our Senior School has a holistic focus, where a strong academic foundation is enriched by extensive co-curricular, community service and wellbeing programs. Students are equipped to graduate as leaders, with the strength of character, confidence and capability to make a positive impact on the world. Delivering the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) curriculum, students work towards achieving their Higher School Certificate, with 85-90 per cent of eligible students accepting university placements.

Outstanding preparation for Kindergarten

It's common for parents to wonder whether their child is ready for Kindergarten, while also feeling excited their child has reached this new milestone.

At TIGS Prep we build the social, emotional and foundational skills that young learners need in order to thrive when they transition into the Junior School. By harnessing the innate curiosity and creativity of children, our preparatory program unlocks the power of play-based learning.

Our program is influenced by the Reggio Emilia approach to education and the Early Years Learning Framework, in which relationships and play are at the forefront and are used to guide learning delivery.

Play is driven by the children's interests, questions, and the world that they live in. The materials available for play add to the children's learning in meaningful ways. The opportunity for children to create their own explorations helps to develop independence and creative thinking. As children guide their own play, social interactions take place and relationships are built.

Language is developed, Mathematics and Science are explored, creativity and The Arts are promoted. Nature finds its way into many scenarios and explorations and the culture and diversity of others is discovered in meaningful ways. Children are truly immersed in their play and learning.

Provocations or experiences are curated by staff after observation of the children to encourage discussion, exploration, experimentation, interest and thinking. Each experience is carefully guided by expert staff who encourage the children to think creatively and problem solve to promote and extend their critical thinking skills.

We believe in the process of learning; where the teachers, parents and the child are viewed as collaborators. Teachers and parents are essential to the child's learning where the exchange and collaboration of ideas is vital in creating a positive learning environment. We encourage parents to be active participants in their child's learning through continual communication and involvement between parents, teachers and the child, and by creating connections within the School and community.

Extended hours

9.00am to 2.30pm – Structured Learning (all children are expected to attend). **7.30am to 5.30pm** – Families have flexibility of arrival and departure times.





A day in the life

From 7.30am - Arrival time

Children can engage in learning experiences in the indoor and outdoor learning environments.

Parents can settle their children and engage with educators.

9.00am - Structured learning

Time is allocated to core learning areas including language and literacy, arts, STEM and social and emotional development.

12.00pm - Lunch

Children bring a healthy morning tea, lunch and afternoon snack to be enjoyed indoors or outdoors.

Lunch can also be ordered from the School Canteen using an online ordering system. Orders are delivered to the classroom.

1.00pm - Rest

Rest or quiet time is enjoyed each day.

Children bring their own sheet, pillow and small blanket for a chance to recharge with dimmed lights and calming background music.

From 2.30pm to 5.30pm – Departure

Children can be collected by an authorised adult at any time until 5.30pm.

Educators are available to discuss your child's adventures and achievements of the day.





Learning in our Junior School delves further than a content driven curriculum and develops conceptual understanding by deepening knowledge and skills within subjects. By making connections across subjects our students transfer learning into new contexts. For example, students may explore English, History and Visual Art through the concept of 'perspective', debating each sides of an argument and understanding the point of view in past events to add dimension and depth to a drawing. This collaborative and inquiry-based approach to learning has a profound effect on outcomes because it caters to different learning styles and develops active, compassionate and lifelong learners.

Beyond the curriculum, students have access to extensive co-curricular, community service, sporting, artistic and Outdoor Education opportunities to create a truly holistic learning journey that strengthens them in character and resilience while also developing a sense of connection and belonging.

The Junior School campus inspires and engages students with facilities designed to support learning, connection and growth. With multiple play spaces, sporting facilities and well-equipped classrooms, the environment cultivates a sense of exploration and wonder.

Senior School

From strength to strength

A holistic education prepares future leaders for success. In the Senior School, students develop in knowledge as well as character so that they can approach complex challenges with clarity, confidence and empathy.

To achieve this, our Senior School is structured with a focus on personal learning excellence and integrates our strategic pillars across all learning areas. The curriculum is delivered progressively to enable opportunities for personalisation as students grow in experience and skill.

Starting with a strong foundation across core subject areas in Year 7. Elective subjects are added in Year 9 and expanded in Year 11 and Year 12.

Senior students also engage in community service to develop their awareness of others, compassion and humility, and are supported with a comprehensive wellbeing program to develop their resilience and sense of belonging.

Student learning is enhanced with the use of significant data analysis. Our deep understanding of each student's strengths and weaknesses allows us to tailor their learning delivery and ensure they are improving day by day.

Our extensive co-curricular program expands learning beyond academics. By exploring their passions, TIGS students attain a wealth of skills and competencies that only experience can provide and drive a deeper understanding of self, relationships and the world.

TIGS students are also active in Sport,

with extensive opportunities available in each
area. From representative Sport to overseas
cultural immersion trips. TIGS students
are equipped with the conceptual and
experiential knowledge needed for a strong

Senior School

Curriculum

Our Senior School students study the NESA curriculum under the guidance and framework of TIGS Mission and Values.

Year 7 and Year 8 The Arts, Biblical Studies, English, HSIE, Mathematics, Music,

PDHPE, Science, Sport, Wellbeing and one Language

(Mandarin, Japanese or French).

Year 9 and Year 10 The Arts, Biblical Studies, Design, English, HSIE, Mathematics, Music,

PDHPE, Science, Sport, Wellbeing, plus two electives.

Year 11 A minimum of 12 Units of electives from the approved list of

Board Developed or Board Endorsed courses, with English as a

mandatory subject.

Year 12 A minimum of 10 Units of electives from the approved list of

Board Developed or Board Endorsed courses, with English as a

mandatory subject.

Year 11 and Year 12 have 31 elective options and 7 extension options.

We provide targeted and intentional personalised pathways to ensure maximum learning growth.

Co-curricular

TIGS offers one of the largest co-curricular programs in the Illawarra in both Junior and Senior School. We believe that academic foundations need to be enriched with practical experiences and that many essential skills cannot be learned solely through the curriculum.

The Arts

From Prep to Year 12, The Arts are an important part of life at TIGS.

An Arts education is vital to the learning and shaping of young people. We believe that everyone is creative and has creative potential; we seek to ignite this potential in each one of our students. Engagement with The Arts activities can increase academic progress, skill development and a sense of wellbeing, not just in the area of The Arts, but across the academic and social landscape.

In the face of an ever-changing world, now, more so than ever, it is important that young people possess the skills that are going to allow them to excel. When creativity is fostered within students, it allows them to become agile and active problem solvers and independent learners.

In The Arts at TIGS, students will find a secure space to be themselves in a collaborative and shared learning environment, with unlimited potential to build their skills and express themselves as people within our world.



Community service

Community service is a prominent feature of life in our School. It is through serving others that we gain a deeper understanding of compassion, humility and empathy. We see these skills as essential for future leaders to make a meaningful impact on the world.

TIGS has partnerships with communities and organisations across Australia including the Coomaditchie and Nganambala First Nations communities, Anglicare, SONY Foundation and Disability Trust. Our students can regularly volunteer or contribute through fundraising.

Academic Support

All students at TIGS are empowered to achieve their best. Our Academic Support team are a core part of our commitment to removing barriers to learning.

High potential learners are given rich opportunities to extend and apply their learning while students who require additional learning support receive personalised specialist assistance and care. This department is well resourced with expert staff to provide the right extension and support to each student.

Our team of school psychologists are also available to support the emotional and mental wellbeing of all students through the ups and downs of their developmental years.

Outdoor Education

Some lessons are best delivered outside the classroom. Our Outdoor Education program takes students into the wild and wonderful places of our planet to learn some of the intangible lessons of life. Lessons of perseverance and determination; friendship and connection to the environment.

Year 3 to Year 6 attend an annual camp that develops their independence, teamwork and confidence.

Year 7 to Year 10 attend a week-long annual camp with a progressive and intentional structure which takes students out of their comfort zones, where they discover new strengths and capabilities.

Year 11 students have the opportunity to attend an Arts Camp at Bundanon, while all Year Groups can take part in the Duke of Edinburgh Award.

Representative Sport

Athletes in most major sports have a pathway into local, state, national and international representation at TIGS. In Junior and Senior School, we encourage students to be ambitious in their goals and strive towards success.

Sport provides the physical, mental and social development that supports wellbeing and strengthens motivation. Our students can progress through NASSA, AICES, NSW CIS or NSW All Schools pathways. Selected students are able to access additional training support through our Talented Athletes Program and Talented Football Program.

Leaders of their future

Our graduates soar to astonishing heights – from astronauts, CEOs and missionaries to health professionals, film producers and sporting greats. TIGS has a proud reputation for advancing young lives in a manner that benefits the broader community.

Your TIGS Strong journey starts here

Step 1 - Application for Enrolment

An Application for Enrolment is submitted online.

Step 2 - Enrolment interview

Before a place is offered, you and your child will be invited to attend an enrolment interview.

Step 3 - Offer of placement

A successful interview and availability of placement will result in an Offer of Enrolment emailed to parents/guardians.

Step 4 - Accepting or declining placement

To accept your child's place at the School, you will be required to sign and return the Acceptance of Offer and pay the Enrolment Fee.

Step 5 - Receipt of acceptance and commencement

Upon receipt of the signed Acceptance of Offer and payment of the Enrolment Fee, your child will be enrolled at TIGS.

Step 6 - Welcome

In the term prior to commencement parents/guardians will be notified of commencement dates, orientation days and any other pertinent information and details that will assist your child's transition to TIGS.
